

One learner, one summer, several highlights

- Got their scores for the FOUR Advanced Placement exams they took in May. Below are their three best scores! After practice tests and months of intensive studying, they walked away with....
 - AP Psychology, 4 out of 5
 - AP English Literature and Composition, 3 out of 5
 - AP English Language and Composition, 3 out of 5
- Completed stipend-paid youth program with Museum of Modern Art and was selected to moderate the final event, including interviewing world-famous actress Chloe Sevigny on stage to a live audience!
- Performed two selections as a part of Lee Strasberg <u>method acting class</u>.
 - Portrait of a Lady on Fire, written by Céline Sciamma (2019) – see photo to the right. Adapted for the stage, they performed an excerpt from an English translation
 - Frank's Crimson Medicine an original stage play (2021)

Learner waitlist grows slowly & why

The unfortunate but truthful news is that our learner waitlist is not as plentiful as the educator one.

- 1) Off Da Beaten Path Learning has not yet been marketed in ways to reach a wide audience.
- 2) This is an expensive service and therefore not accessible to most. \$100 an hour is a comparable rate for 1-on-1 education and homeschool support. One person described it as "education therapy," which I think is somewhat apt. 1-on-1 self-directed education is powerful work, and professional support should not be limited to those who have the financial capability.

To address this point of tension, Off Da Beaten Path Learning is on the constant prowl for grants, partnerships, and other forms of funding.

Educator waitlist grows quickly & why

Fortunately, educators do not have to pay for working with Off Da Beaten Path Learning. Everyone that works with Off Da Beaten Path Learning is paid well. Our educators-in-training, once the first cohort hopefully begins next year, are paid to learn! After their 260-hour training experience and certification, Off Da Beaten Path offers great benefits such as choose-your-own professional development options, educator mentorship, unlimited paid time off, consistent and competitive pay, flexible hours, and more.

We now had initial conversations with 8 educators who are interested in training!

Partnership vision board

My vision of Off Da Beaten Path Learning includes a plethora of partnerships. We have already worked with a handful of one-time volunteers and contractors. We are in active conversations with local New York institutions to see if we can work together helping young people. My vision for the educator training program is that its certification will receive oversight and evaluation from a third-party higher education institution. I have reached out to a half dozen colleges and universities so far.

Partnerships have benefits worth being explicit about.

- 1) Our impact is stronger the wider our network!
- 2) It's more fun. The more, the merrier.
- 3) It allows blending of ideas and approaches while staying independent and true to our values as an education company.
- 4) How are youth and their families going to find out about alternatives in education unless people are talking about it? Self-directed education and other forms of alternative education need to be options more widely discussed. Because of COVID-19, and everything that came with it, "almost two million students have left a traditional public school." (<u>The Hill, 2022</u>) Homeschool numbers have skyrocketed as enrollment into school has plummeted. Youth and families deserve to know their options! Partnerships make that more possible.
- 5) Partners may agree to fund the 1-on-1 education of learners who would not otherwise be able to afford Off Da Beaten Path's services.




Yass Prize application is in!
